ADOPTING A DDR DOG!

















MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ADOPTION

Most often, our dogs are placed into homes within 5 hours of the DFW Metroplex. We do reserve the right to consider homes outside the 5 hour radius, but we absolutely will not ship dogs. *DDR reserves* the right to determine the appropriate adoption distance, case by case, with the best interest of the dog in mind. Adopting families must be willing to drive to where the dog is in foster care for a meet and greet and to pick up their doodle upon approval. We do not place dogs for the purpose of guarding, fighting or breeding.

- All applicants must be at least 21 years of age.
- All current pets must be spayed and neutered.
- Participation in formal obedience training and socialization sometimes required.
- Demonstrated responsible dog ownership, and primary care giver of a dog (INCLUDING Spay/Neuter and current vaccinations of all family pets).
- Dog must live INSIDE as a member of the family.
- Must be willing to travel to the foster family for the meet-and-greet, and, if necessary, travel to
 the partner vet for spay/neuter or any follow-up vaccinations or medical treatment being paid
 for by Doodle Dandy Rescue.
- If you rent, we require a letter from your landlord giving you permission to keep a dog on the premises, specifically noting if there are weight limits.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

- Application processing time averages one to three weeks
- You may not get the first dog you apply for, we strongly encourage you to stay in touch and to continue to apply for dogs.
- A separate application is required for each dog for whom you are applying.
- All applications are reviewed for each dog and the decision on who adopts the dog is based on the dog's needs.

ADOPTING A DDR DOG!



- For the safety or security of the dog all information on the applications is verified. A home visit or home visit video is required.
- A DDR adoption representative will contact the adopter to discuss the adoption process.
- Once you are selected you will be given the opportunity to meet the dog. The time and place will be determined case by case and at the foster's convenience.
- After meeting the dog the adopter must request a contract from the DDR adoption representative within 24 hours.
- The adoption will be finalized once you have signed the adoption contract and provided the adoption donation.
- Once the adoption is complete, you will be provided all the medical and chip records.
- Adopting families will have access to an adoption follow-up team member.
- Once a dog is placed and in the new home all other applicants will be notified.

THINGS WORTH NOTING ABOUT ADOPTING A DOODLE DANDY RESCUE DOG

- Most often, our dogs are placed into homes within the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.
- Doodle Dandy Rescue is under NO obligation to adopt an animal to any individual.
- An adoption donation and signed adoption contract is expected before you receive your doodle.
- Upon adoption, copies of all available records will be provided to the family. All animals are
 microchipped, spayed/neutered prior to placement (unless adopted as puppies), are current on
 age-appropriate vaccinations, de-wormed if appropriate, on heartworm preventative and flea and
 tick preventative.
- After adoption, Doodle Dandy Rescue will only be responsible for known, agreed-upon medical care.
- Dogs with training needs will only be adopted to homes where they can ensure proper training.
- Dogs are temperament tested by our volunteers/foster homes and their health and temperament monitored prior to placement, but we CANNOT MAKE ANY GUARANTEES.
- If, for any reason and at any point during your new pet's life, you find yourself unable to keep him/her, YOU ARE OBLIGATED TO CONTACT DOODLE DANDY RESCUE SO THAT WE CAN MANAGE THE REHOMING PROCESS.

FOSTER TO ADOPT

- YES! Doodle Dandy Rescue supports fostering to adopt!
- If a foster family decides to adopt, the family WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY THE FULL ADOPTION FEE, there are no discounts.
- If the foster decides not to adopt their current foster dog, they are still required to complete the fostering process through to adoption.
- We hope foster to adopt families will still continue to foster with us even after they've adopted!
- People who foster to adopt must abide by all of the same adoption policies as all other adoptive families.
